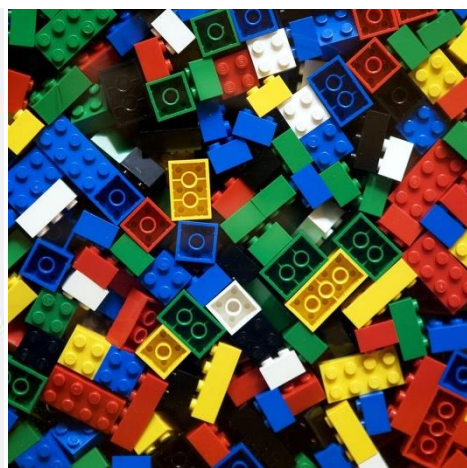

CLUBS INFORMATION

John Wollaston Anglican Community School offers a range of after-school Clubs for the enjoyment, social development, and character enhancement of students in Years 7, 8 and 9. This program also promotes a sense of community and encourages students to represent their school, 'give back' to the community or discover and enjoy their interests. The clubs program provides an opportunity for students 7-9 to work with and get to know students who share a similar passion.

- It is compulsory for students in Years 7, 8 and 9 to participate in a Club. Clubs will run from Weeks 3 to 9 in Terms 1 and 2. The exceptions are Equestrian Club, School Production/Drama, Lego League and Art Masterclass. Please read the time requirements for these clubs before applying.
- Attendance at all Clubs is compulsory. Attendance will be taken.
- If a student is going to be absent, written notification from a parent/guardian must be forwarded to the Club's Teacher in Charge or to Student Services Reception. Students who are absent from their Club commitment without written notification will receive a lunch detention.
- Please check the Clubs Booklet regarding information on costs. If there is no cost listed, the club is free of cost.
- Students are required to select three (3) options, in order of preference. If selecting JSAS or you are in a School Production/Drama event, please select the 1st Choice option only. Students will select their preferences via a Microsoft forms link sent via Direct Message.
- Clubs will be filled on a first in basis. Once a student has selected and been accepted into a Club, it is unlikely that they will be able to move to another Club, so choices need to be made thoughtfully.
- Students may elect to participate in more than one Club provided there are spaces available.
- Queries about Club membership may be directed to the Co-Curricular Coordinator, Miss Melanie Fowler; the student's Head of House or to the Dean of Pastoral Care, Ms Kylie Virgo.

Arduino Club



Are you interested in programming? Are you interested in electrical circuits? What about robotics?

If the answer is yes, you should sign up for the Arduino Club!

Arduinos are a microcontroller, think simple computer. They can be used to act as the brain in electronic devices and circuits. In this club you will be building electrical circuits. These will contain a range of devices like lights, speakers, servo-motors and LCD screens. You will attach these to an Arduino which you will learn to program to control the electrical circuit you have made. We will be following the Code with Conner program which contains more than 20 activities all fully supported by written instructions and walk through videos!

Make and Fly a Boomerang Club

For this year's workshop club, we will be designing and making a boomerang, and then, we will learn to fly them like a pro.

Your boomerang can be a traditional shape, or you could make a competition or Trefoil design. We might even be able to make several different designs each. I already have templates ready to use for shaping.

After cutting out and smoothing the edges of your boomerang, I will then teach you how to create aerofoils to create lift so they can fly in an arc and return to you.

All boomerangs will be made from high-quality marine-grade plywood, which will make them strong but light (and safe).

Once we have done an initial test flight, we will make some final adjustments, and then you can colour your boomerang any way you like. Come and join the flight club.

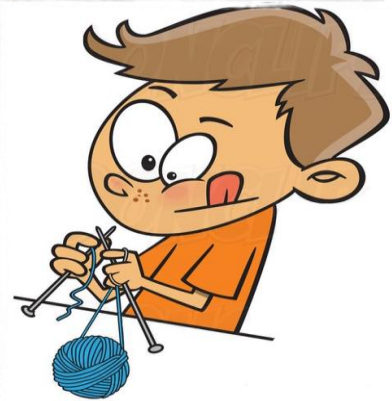

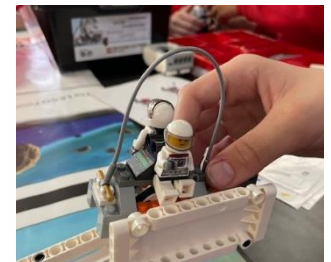

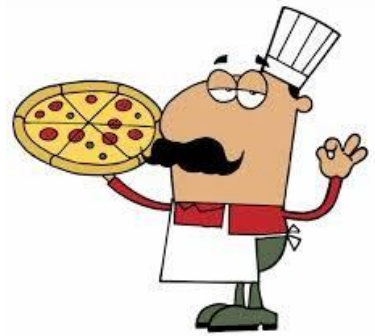
